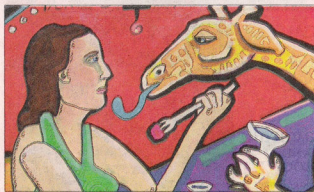

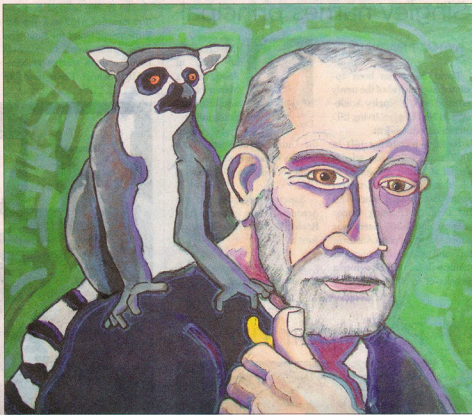
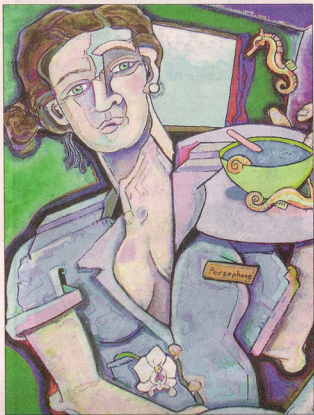

## North Lake features bold Austin artist

A retrospective of Austin artist Skip Noah will be shown at North Lake College, 5001 N MacArthur Blvd., until July 7.

The exhibition, titled "Giraffes and Seahorses," will display more than 20 pieces of art, created over a span of time ranging from the early 1990s to this year.

Although some pieces are from private collections, others will be for sale, ranging in price from \$800 to \$1,500.

Noah said he was excited and flattered when North Lake officials tapped him for the show.

"Showing in a college environment is one of my favorites, because I'm reaching a lot of people that normally don't see artwork in their everyday lives," he said. "Irving has received me well, and I've had a lot of really positive feedback about the show."

The exhibit will run until July 7. Admission is free. Hours are 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday and Saturday on the second floor of building A.
